Airlines and Airports

Long Beach Airport (LGB)

Long Beach Airport is a public airport three miles northeast of downtown Long Beach, in Los Angeles County, California, United States. As of October 2024 the airport hosts three airlines; Delta Air Lines, Hawaiian Airlines, and Southwest Airlines; and offers 22 nonstop destinations. It is located approximately 7 miles from ACPA25's home at the Hyatt Regency Long Beach.



Los Angeles Airport (LAX)

Los Angeles International Airport is the primary international airport serving Los Angeles and its surrounding metropolitan area in California. As of October 2024 the airport hosts 70 airlines and offers 181 nonstop destinations. It is located approximately 22 miles from ACPA25's home at the Hyatt Regency Long Beach, though with traffic it takes about an hour to get from LAX to the Convention Center.

John Wayne Santa Ana Airport (SNA)

John Wayne Airport is an international commercial and general aviation airport that serves Orange County, California, and the Greater Los Angeles area. The airport is located in an unincorporated area of Orange County, and it is owned and operated by the county. As of October 2024 the airport hosts 12 airlines and offers 46 nonstop destinations. It is located approximately 25 miles from ACPA25's home at the Hyatt Regency Long Beach and the trip should take 25-30 minutes with no traffic.

Driving

The Long Beach Convention Center is located at 300 East Ocean Boulevard in Long Beach, CA. Coming from Los Angeles International Airport (LAX), take 405 south, then take 710 south. Downtown Long Beach is located at the end of the 710 freeway. Coming from Long Beach Airport (LGB) or Orange County's John Wayne Airport (SNA), take 405 north, then take 710 south. Downtown Long Beach is located at the end of the 710 freeway.

Coming from the Inland Empire area, take 91 west to 710 south. Downtown Long Beach is located at the end of the 710 freeway.

Coming from Southern Orange County, take the Santa Ana Freeway (5) north to the San Diego Freeway (405). Take the San Diego Freeway (405) north to the Long Beach Freeway (710). Go south on the Long Beach Freeway to the Downtown Exits. (710 then becomes Shoreline Drive). Follow Shoreline Drive into the downtown area.

Coming from North Orange County and San Gabriel & Pomona Valleys take the Orange Freeway (57) or San Gabriel Freeway (605) to the Riverside Freeway (91) to the Long Beach Freeway (710). Go south on the Long Beach Freeway to the Downtown Exits. (710 then becomes Shoreline Drive). Follow Shoreline Drive into the downtown area.

Public Transportation

Looking for a quick and easy way to and around Long Beach without the hassle and haggle of traffic and parking rates? There are a number of smart public transportation options available.

<u>Metro Link</u>: Take the Metro Blue Line, L.A.'s first light rail transit system which runs from 7th Street in Downtown L.A., to downtown Long Beach. Bicycles are allowed on Metro Rail with some restrictions during peak hours and bicycle racks are available first-come, first-serve on Metro buses.

<u>Long Beach Transit</u>: Take advantage of the city's public transportation services available both on land and water! For only \$1.25, per one-way fare, Long Beach Transit links you up with local destinations such as Belmont Shore, Alamitos Bay and Cal State Long Beach.

<u>Amtrak</u>: From L.A.'s Union Station take the Metro to Long Beach.

Taxis & Rideshare

<u>Taxis</u>, <u>Uber</u> and <u>Lyft</u> are very prominent and accessible in Long Beach. Download the apps before you arrive for easy access to request a ride when you arrive.

The City of Long Beach owns and operates the Long Beach Bike Share program.

Parking

The Hyatt Regency Long Beach (Headquarter Hotel) and The Westin Long Beach both offer self-parking at \$40/night and valet parking at \$45/night. Parking is available at Courtyard Long Beach Downtown with self-parking available at \$37/night and valet parking at \$41/day. Parking is available at Marriott Long Beach Downtown at \$41/day.

Self-parking is available for the Convention Center at a flat rate during Scheduled Events only. The Promenade Garage is the garage closest to Convention meeting spaces. Cash, VISA, Mastercard, Discover and American Express are accepted.

The City of Long Beach offers free parking for the first two hours at three city lots all located off of Pine Ave. The City has partnered with Passport to create a hassle-free mobile parking payment application now available in the Apple App Store and the Google Play store. Park at the participating lots below, enter zone number and add time or pay for a parking session in full.
